HOLLY SPRINGS, MS – Rust College held its 158th commencement exercises on Saturday, May 4, 2024, at 11:00 a.m. on the Grand Lawn of the McCoy Administration Building. The college celebrated the achievements of 68 graduates who received their bachelor's degrees.

The commencement ceremony was filled with pomp and circumstance, and the graduates marched in their caps and gowns, ready to embark on their next chapter. The esteemed guest speaker, Rev. Dr. Frederick D. Haynes, III, Pastor of Friendship West Baptist Church in Dallas, Texas, delivered an inspiring address to the class.
